I have been writing computer software for more than 40 years, using a variety of languages, operating systems, etc. When I started, there were no software patents; with luck, they will have disappeared again by the time I exit the field.

I have no legal training, either in general or in the field of patent law. However, my experience as a programmer tells me that software patents are a burden to the industry, with very detrimental effects on productivity.

Programmers produce inventions continually; it is a fundamental part of their work. Expecting them to search through millions of patents to find out whether each line of code is patented is an unreasonable and unrealistic burden.
